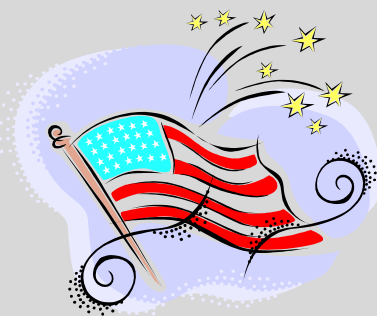

Crawfish Boil and Charity Auction

The Crawfish Boil and Charity Silent Auction was held at John and Dale Maggiore's home in Hammond. Thirty two people attended, which included members, spouses, and friends.

The event was a big success and everyone had a great time. Although bad weather was predicted, the weather gave us a break with minimal rain/mist, overcast skies, and relatively cool temperatures. John, Ralph, and Randy did the cooking and boiling, and met the high standard that is expected from Southern Louisiana chefs.

The official time for the event was from 1 PM to 4 PM, although a number of folks arrived much earlier (around 10:30 AM) to assist with the cooking and to setup the silent auction.

Jim Boudreaux officially welcomed everyone to the event, and briefly discussed the silent auction and the upcoming Chapter Road Tour to Tupelo, Mississippi. The silent auction was held to benefit New Orleans Children's Hospital and to satisfy the charity event requirement for the NCRS Top Flight Chapter Award Program. The Tupelo Road Tour will be an official chapter road tour, and will be done in conjunction with the Confederation of Corvette Clubs of Louisiana (CCCL). The road tour is planned for June 12-14.



Buddy Gegenheimer reviewed details of the road tour, starting time and location, and the various individual events and attractions planned as part of the overall event. It will be a lot of fun and a chance to drive your Corvette, and to have a great time with fellow Corvette Club members. Felix Famularo will lead for the Louisiana Chapter and will be our primary contact.

The charity silent auction started at 2 PM and lasted until 3:30 PM. Over twenty items were collected and auctioned off to the highest bidder. There was a mix of Corvette parts as well as non-Corvette items. Bidding was excellent, with outstanding participation from the group. At the end of the auction Larry announced the winners of each of the items. A total of \$1160 was collected from auction sales and from cash donations. The monies will be donated to New Orleans Children's Hospital, and a request will be submitted to the NCRS National for additional (\$1000 max) matching funds. This should make the total donation to the Children's Hospital over \$2000!! Congratulations to everyone who participated and who donated or bought items. Jim will make the donation/presentation to CHNO at the May 31 WDSU TV telethon for this charity.

Most of the group began to leave around 4 PM, although a few folks were still talking and eating when I left at 5:30 PM.

Special thanks to John and Dale for hosting this event and to John, Ralph, and Randy for the excellent food. Also thanks to Larry and everyone who helped make the charity auction a success.

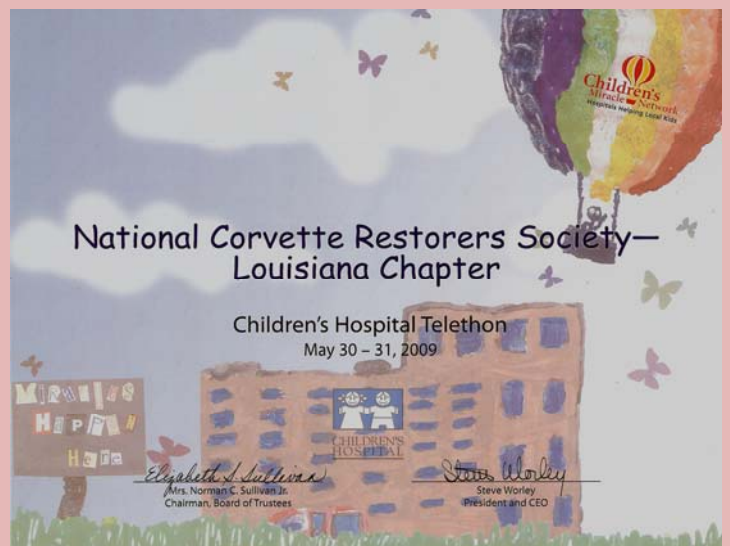

We had chicken, fried catfish, vegetables, hush puppies, fries, and coleslaw and the food was ample in portion and delicious. I am so glad that I took a “doggy bag” after we finished the meal, since it went to a very worthy cause...two sweet dogs at a gas station near Tupelo. The mama dog was part pit-bull and the poor little lame dog really enjoyed the fish, chicken, and fries for their dinner! After leaving the Cock Of The Walk, we travelled through the Natchez Trace, and the trees and water were beautiful. We had a lovely stop at the Jeff Busby Overlook and many of us took pictures of our wonderful Corvettes and each other with the canyon below. Some of us got to contribute to the festivity by interjecting our favorite Elvis songs for all to hear on their Motorola hand- held radios. Our presenter told us that little Elvis said, “That’s Alright, Mama” Ha! So, that is where our talented little Elvis started his lifelong music journey! We had a very informative talk by Mr. George Booth, the owner of this quaint and unique hardware store, and many of us bought our beany baby hound dogs, guitar picks, and key rings to remember our trip to this historic, large hardware store.

From there, we headed over to Elvis’ Birthplace to tour his two bedroom home, which Vernon Presley built for \$180, which he had to borrow. Elvis, Vernon, and Gladys only got to live there until he was three, since they didn’t have enough money to pay the mortgage, and Vernon had difficulty finding employment. The family had to live with his Aunt Delta and Grandmother until his family moved to Memphis to live in a government subsidized home in Whitehaven. One of the saddest things that happened to this family was that Vernon had to serve time in prison for issuing some bad checks to buy food for his family. How tragic... I feel that these hard times were the reason that Elvis was always so generous in his adult life and gave many people Cadillacs, houses, jewelry, wheelchairs, and other things that they could not afford. He never forgot his destitute youth and those folks who could use some help. The small cottage was very authentic and we were allowed to take many pictures inside and out. The Elvis Museum and Chapel were very nicely done and we took lots of pictures by the large cut-outs of Elvis.

That evening we ventured back to the Auto Museum and had a fantastic dinner which had beef, potato salad, coleslaw, barbequed beans, and pudding. 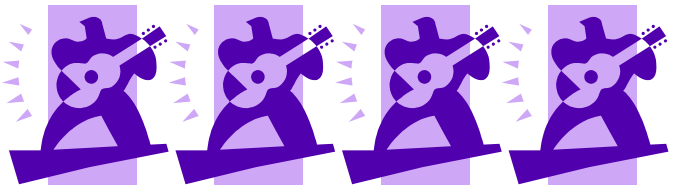
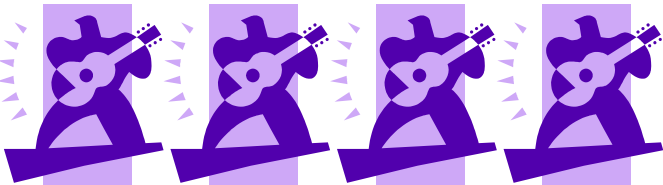

Chapter Award Program Status

June 2009

We continue to make excellent progress toward achieving a Chapter Top Flight Award for this year.

Since the last update in the May newsletter, we have completed two more **Required Activities** and one additional **Variable Activity**.

The two **Required Activities** that were completed were the Chapter Social Event (May 23 Crawfish Boil at John and Dale Maggiore's home) and the Chapter Charitable Event (May 23 Silent Auction for New Orleans Children's Hospital). The **Variable Activity** was to make a donation greater than \$100 to the charity. We greatly surpassed this amount with a total donation of \$1160. Jim Boudreaux presented the check during the WDSU TV Telethon for Children's Hospital on May 31. A matching funds request is being prepared and will be sent to the NCRS National Club. We hope to present the additional donation to the Children's Hospital later this year.

We have currently completed five of the eight **Required Activities** for a Top Flight Award. The three remaining activities are a Chapter Road Tour, Technical Seminar, and a Judging Meet. These activities are in various stages of planning at this time and should present no issues for completing this year. The first Road Tour is scheduled for June 12-14 to Tupelo, Mississippi. The second Road Tour is scheduled for Labor Day Week-end, September 3-5, for the 15th Anniversary of the National Corvette Museum. Gary Cox has agreed to present a technical seminar on Testing Corvette Distributors at the July meeting. Judging Meets (mini-meets) are currently scheduled for September and November.

We are also looking good on the **Variable Activities** that we need. For the Top Flight Award we need to complete six of the seven variable activities. To date, we have completed two. However, the remaining four are simply getting a minimum number of members and Corvettes to the road tours and judging meets later this year. I do not foresee a problem.

At this time our Chapter Membership is around 70; so judging at least 5% of members cars means judging four (4) cars, and having at least 15% of the members driving their cars to a Chapter Event means we need 11 members to drive their cars to the events. So far eight Corvettes have been driven to our meetings/events. The weather has not helped us much, and hopefully the rest of the year will be better.

The seventh (remaining) variable activity is to have six technical articles published in the Crossed Flags newsletters during the year. This is more challenging, and fortunately it is not required to get the award. However, I know Bill and the rest of the membership would welcome a good technical article for the newsletter. Everyone will benefit. So if you have a good technical article, please share it. It could also be used as a first step in getting the article published in the NCRS Restorer.

The Second Quarter Update for the Chapter Award Program will be mailed to the National later this month. We still have two more quarters to go. I will continue to keep everyone posted.

NCRS Chapter Award Program

The **NCRS Chapter Award Program** was developed to promote involvement and participation by members in their chapter events while encouraging the sharing of knowledge in the restoration and preservation of the Corvette. The program measures the performance of each chapter against standard award criteria similar to the principal used in NCRS judging. Each chapter is eligible to receive an award every year after submitting the required quarterly reports and fulfilling the required criteria

The Award Program is based on the calendar year January 1 to December 31. Recognition Certificates are issued in February, and the award is presented to the chapter at the National Convention

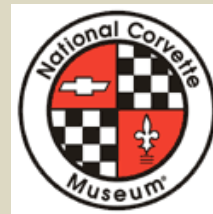
